



Remembrance Sunday



The 1st Reading - Ecclesiasticus 44:1-15

Let us now sing the praises of famous men, our ancestors in their generations. The Lord apportioned to them great glory, his majesty from the beginning. There were those who ruled in their kingdoms and made a name for themselves by their strength; those who gave counsel because they were intelligent; those who spoke in prophetic oracles; those who led the people by their counsels and by their knowledge of the people's lore; they were wise in their words of instruction; those who composed musical tunes or put verses in writing; rich men endowed with resources, living peacefully in their homes—

all these were honoured in their generations and were the pride of their times. Some of them have left behind a name, so that others declare their praise. But of others there is no memory; they have perished as though they had never existed; they have become as though they had never been born, they and their children after them. But these also were men of compassion whose righteous deeds have not been forgotten; their wealth will remain with their descendants and their inheritance with their children's children. Their descendants stand by the covenants; their children also, for their sake. Their offspring will continue forever, and their glory will never be blotted out. Their bodies are buried in peace, but their name lives on generation after generation. The assembly declares their wisdom, and the congregation proclaims their praise.

The 2nd Reading - Luke 20:27-38

²⁷Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to Jesus, and asked him a question, ²⁸'Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. ²⁹Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; ³⁰then the second ³¹and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. ³²Finally the woman also died. ³³In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.' ³⁴Jesus said to them, 'Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; ³⁵but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. ³⁶Indeed they cannot die any more, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. ³⁷And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. ³⁸Now he is God not of the dead, but of the



living; for to him all of them are alive.'

The Psalm (Evensong) - 40

I waited patiently/ for the / Lord : and he inclined unto / me and / heard my / calling.

He brought me also out of the horrible pit, out of the / mire and / clay : and set my feet upon the rock, and / ordered / my / goings.

And he hath put a new / song in my / mouth : even a / thanks • giving / unto our / God.

Many shall / see it and / fear : and shall / put their / trust in he / Lord.

Blessed is the man that hath set his / hope in the / Lord : and turned not unto the proud, and to such as / go a/bout with / lies.

O Lord my God, great are the wondrous works which thou hast done, like as be also thy thoughts which / are to / us-ward : and yet there is no man that / ordereth them / unto / thee.

If I should de/clare them and / speak of them : they should be more than I am / able / to ex/press.

Sacrifice and meat-offering thou / wouldest / not : but mine / ears hast / thou / opened.

Burnt-offerings and sacrifice for sin hast thou / not re/quired : then / said I / Lo I / come,

In the volume of the book it is written of me, that I should fulfil thy will / O my / God : I am content to do it, yea thy law / is with/in my / heart.

I have declared thy righteousness in the great / congre/gation : lo I will not refrain my lips O / Lord and / that thou / knowest.
